Have you ever felt inadequate or insufficient when it comes to living and witnessing for God? I know many times, I bow my head and ask the Lord how could I ever be of use to you? Recently my family and I were greatly encouraged as we were reading through the Gospel of John. In John 1:6-9, God introduces us to John the Baptist and his relationship with the Word (Jesus Christ). First, we are introduced to his nature, "there was a man." Second we are introduced to his authority, "he was sent by God." Third, we are introduced to his name, "John," which interestingly means *the grace of God*. Then finally we are introduced to his purpose in that "he came for a witness."
